Lieutenant Colonel Andrew Fleming Commander, 5 Wing Goose Bay



Lieutenant Colonel Fleming enrolled in the Canadian Forces in 1986 during his Mechanical Engineering studies at the University of Toronto. His early postings were with the

Assistant Deputy Minister Material Group. In Ottawa, as a Deputy Aircraft Engineering Officer, he managed the engineering and logistics support programs for the DASH 8 aircraft fleet. Then during two tours at the Aerospace Engineering Test Establishment in Cold Lake, he served as an aerodynamicist, armament systems engineer, flight test engineer, project manager and section head.

Subsequently, he moved to 423 Maritime Helicopter Squadron, where he supported Sea King operations during a three year term as the Squadron Aircraft

Maintenance and Engineering Officer.

Later he assumed a series of Executive Assistant positions at NDHQ, including EA to the Deputy Chief of Defence Staff and then to the Chief of Defence Staff's Director of the Strategic Joint Staff. In 2008, Lieutenant Colonel Fleming returned to the Aerospace Engineering Test Establishment where he served as the Officer Commanding Evaluation Support.

Lieutenant Colonel Fleming holds a Master of Science in Aerospace Engineering from the University of Tennessee and a Master of Business Administration from Queen's University. He is a graduate of the United States Naval Test Pilot School and the Canadian Forces College Joint Command and Staff Program. He is also a licensed Professional Engineer and has accumulated over 550 flying hours on 30 different aircraft types. He enjoys participating in sports, particularly with his family which includes two young children, and coaching hockey and soccer.
